A) Consider approving Ordinance No. 1168, providing for the annexation of the Northeast Quarter (NE/4) of Section 21, Township 12 North, Range 6 West of the Indian Meridian, Canadian County, Oklahoma, into the corporate limits and as part of the City of Yukon, Oklahoma; amending Ordinance No. 657, Appendix A of the Code of the City of Yukon, Oklahoma, by providing that the Northeast Quarter (NE/4) of Section 21, Township 12 North, Range 6 West of

the Indian Meridian, less the highway easement, be zoned "I-2" District (Heavy Industrial District); and declaring an emergency

A motion to approve Ordinance No.1168, providing for the annexation of the Northeast Quarter (NE/4) of Section 21, Township 12 North, Range 6 West of the Indian Meridian, Canadian County, Oklahoma, into the corporate limits and as part of the City of Yukon, Oklahoma; amending Ordinance No. 657, Appendix A of the Code of the City of Yukon, Oklahoma, by providing that the Northeast Quarter (NE/4) of Section 21, Township 12 North, Range 6 West of the Indian Meridian, less the highway easement, be zoned "I-2" District (Heavy Industrial District); and declaring an emergency, was made by Vice Mayor Bradway. Council Member Larson seconded the motion for approval.

Maxine Radcliff appeared before the Council and stated she lived west of Yukon and her family owns land in the area being discussed. She said she would like to see if what is being proposed is legal, as there is a 100' buffer zone there that goes to Southwest 15th and it is owned by El Reno. Mrs. Radcliff said to her knowledge, El Reno has never taken this area off of their property.

City Attorney Mike Segler said that several years ago, El Reno did place a buffer, but it is legal for Yukon to annex this land and the buffer is not relevant.

Mrs. Radcliff said she did know what she was talking about and asked how this can be annexed with the buffer.

Mr. Segler said if the land in question is adjacent to or contiguous to the city's boundary, it is legal to annex it.

Mrs. Radcliff said, "I am 80 years old and know the law. I think you're trying to bluff us and I do know the buffer goes south to 15th Street."

Ron Bohannan, 3900 North Banner Road, El Reno, asked if "adjacent" meant catty-corner or next to? He said that Mrs. Radcliff says the Houck's property is adjacent to Oklahoma City. Mr. Bohannan asked Mr. Segler what statute says this land can be annexed.

Mr. Segler said he could not recall the specific statute at this time.

City Manager Jim Crosby told Mr. Bohannan that Mr. Segler doesn't have to answer this question; that he has researched the issue and has given the Council his opinion that the land in question can be annexed into Yukon. Mr. Crosby advised Mr. Bohannan if he wanted to debate the issue, he can do so at a later time and that Mr. Segler does not have to answer to him. He stated that if Mr. Bohannan does not like the opinion, he can take it to court.

Mayor Alberts said it is his understanding that Mr. Segler feels confident that it is contiguous and therefore legal to annex. Mr. Alberts said the City Attorney has answered his question and that the points come together and that is contiguous.

Mr. Bohannan said his question has not been answered - he asked what statute says this is legal.

Mr. Alberts said there is a law on the books, but Mr. Segler just can't recall the specific statute at the time; however, he feels his research indicates this is a legal process.

Vice Mayor Bradway asked if this wasn't an unsolicited request by Mr. Williams that happened after the Attorney General ruled?

Mr. Bradway was advised by the City Attorney he was correct.

Mr. Segler said that the property owner filed a petition asking to be annexed and no one solicited the property owners. Mr. Segler advised that Mr. Williams said he did not want to be a part of Banner if the case should be changed.

Vice Mayor Bradway said that Mr. Williams is requesting to be a part of the City of Yukon.

Mrs. Radcliff asked how the City plans to deal with the 100' buffer zone.

Mr. Segler said in his opinion this did not pose a problem.

Mrs. Radcliff asked how that could be since the county still shows this as being on record.

The City Attorney stated that El Reno has de-annexed the area.

Mrs. Radcliff said that wasn't the case, as the buffer is on her property.

Mr. Bohannon said that if CPI Pipe wants to be a part of Yukon, that is fine, and that "they" had tried to get Yukon to annex "us" years ago for protection of their property, but Yukon wouldn't do it. Mr. Bohannon asked what would happen to the other properties.

Mr. Segler said Yukon did not solicit this annexation and does not want anyone to be part of Yukon that does not want to be.

Mr. Bohannon said that part of the people in question do not want to be part of El Reno, but they are all concerned about what will happen to their property. He stated that Banner tried to become a town to protect the homeowners from things they don't want in their neighborhoods. He said this was the reason they went to the state the second time.

Mayor Alberts asked the City Attorney if he was confident we are in acting within our legal limits on this matter and Mr. Segler confirmed he was.

A roll call vote was taken. The vote:
